

Free websites available to all

- Cyndi's List, <http://cyndislist.com/> is a collection of links to worthwhile genealogy websites, arranged by category.
- Family Search, <http://www.familysearch.org>, is an invaluable resource providing international coverage.
- RootsWeb, <http://www.rootsweb.ancestry.com/>, is a significant and varied collection of resources with an option for interaction and assistance between users.
- *The Social Security Death Index* can be very helpful in discovering a date of death for people who have died within roughly the last fifty years. This resource is available from several different websites which have different rates for updating it.
- USGenWeb, <http://www.usgenweb.org>, presents the work of a vast network of volunteers for communities across the country. The main page can be used to locate state, county, and municipal pages which offer posted collections of information as well as the opportunity to make queries of the other users. Plus many more, with more limited scope of coverage.

Websites for Researching Plainfield Area Families

- New Jersey State Archives, at <http://www.state.nj.us/state/darm/links/archives.html> offers a growing collection of online searchable databases as well as information about obtaining older vital records for the state.
- Plainfield Public Library offers searchable digitized collections of Plainfield postcards, photographs, and blueprints, as well as a collection of digitized city directories covering the years 1870-1982 (with gaps) which can be searched and viewed on library computers. Collections of Plainfield materials are outlined on the library's Local History Collections page. Links to additional, outside websites are detailed on the library's FAQ's page.

- USGenWeb's Plainfield page, at <http://home.comcast.net/~njunion/plainfield.html>, provides an overview of resources and some valuable links to historic maps and cemetery records, in particular.
